Cold winters.

The low pay for jobs is the greatest weakness

Weather in the winters.

Not being willing to join up economically with Spokane County. It would lower the overall cost of living.

The weakness I think is the amount of gang stuff that I see around now and drugs.

Lack of public transportation.

Lack of effective business education in the area.

Lack of year round employment.

Liberalism.

No jobs, low income. I have three grown adults that are having trouble finding jobs.

A lot of transits.

Can't make a good living.

The greatest drawback is jobs.

Local politicians over which direction the city is going to go. They make decisions, people fight over old decisions. Because of that the community is unable to support a work force.

It would have to be the structure of the roads.

Transportation could be a little better. I think we could use some improvement in some places.

The wages are horrible. It's hard to develop an income.

The thing we dislike the now is the amount of traffic. With growth comes traffic.

I would say it is the tendency for political groups to hide out here.

Our family isn't here and close to us.

The small number of people that are in control of what goes on community wise. Politically and financially there are a small number of people that control everything.

I live in a place that has coyotes and I don't like having to worry about my dog.

The one political system. That's all they have is one political system. I'm one of two Democrats in the thousands of people around, it's not very diverse politically.

They need more living wage jobs here.

The road structure at this point. For example, areas like Apple Way and highway 95.

There is too much spending by city government.

When we moved here we found the education system is poor. It was sad to see my daughter to bring home books that were discarded from Montana. They didn't offer as many classes or subjects as the previous school.

We need to offer more organized activities for kids. They just keep getting more strict about what they can and cannot do. Kids with lower income do not have a whole lot they can do.

Right now I would say the crime rate.

I would have to say the local government leadership.

Low wages.

Compared to Spokane, it has lower paying jobs. Once I graduate I will be going to Spokane because they will have better, high paying jobs over there.

When you go shopping there isn't a big choice for items.

I would say the weather. I think that the winters are pretty harsh. I also think that they are a little too dependent on the Spokane Community for the economy.

Service jobs that don't pay well. That makes affordable housing unreachable, and people with minimum wage jobs don't have health insurance.

The political parties that are around here.

I think they put too much interest in how old this city is when it's actually got a lot of people in it. It's too busy and too populated, especially the downtown area.

Sometimes it's the tourism and stuff, especially with Iron Man, I don't think they take the local's consideration into those things. I understand that's how they make their money, but there should be better communication with locals, at least better with

It can be hard to find a job in the area. Jobs that you can live on are hard to find. I have known people that have 3 or 4 jobs. Affordable housing is also very difficult to find.

I haven't lived there as an adult, I'm a student in a different state. Some friends that live there say there's not a lot of people our age there.

Probably the fact that its jobs don't pay very well here. Average jobs, not something not where you're CEO or that kind of thing, just for the average working person.

Lack of marketing to let people know we are more than a tourist spot.

It's growing like a weed.

Economy and low pay jobs. Right to work state.

Probably lack of parking in the downtown area for sure.

The traffic is starting to get real bad!

Right now is traffic.

I don't know.

Q7. In the time you've been here, do you think greater Coeur d'Alene has become a better place to live, a worse place, or has it stayed the same?

Crime is getting worse in that area. My daughter was mugged inside Wal-Mart and nothing was done about it. There are constant speeders and drunk drivers.

With the population growth, it's increased higher cost of living, it's caused for more of a self-centered, fast-paced society. It's becoming more California-ized with the high life. That's the biggest one to stand out to me.

Traffic has gotten more difficult. Density of population has become greater.

Nothing has really changed. But the locals talk about amenities

Liberal influence moving in

CDA is growing and becoming more stable.

When I first came here I had a hard time finding a job because of my ethnicity.

It just has

There's a lot more open minded people, a lot more people have moved in to make it better.

There's been a lot more opportunities for people live there now then there was before. Whether it's work, or off-time activity. And you really don't see much of a crime rate. I haven't seen that much since I've been there.

I think I appreciate more as I get older and I haven't seen much change around here.

I think that it's great other than the traffic, it's definitely grown.

I just haven't noticed any changes. We live and we are happy.

I think the administrations are in the right direction of making it better.

There are many more people.

Growth has been good with businesses

There have been more people so that increased the amount of crime and drugs.

Not enough, I'd like to see some more, things have gotten better but I'm all for expansion, there's room for improvement. There's so much service industry here, I'd like to see people move up as well.

Quality of the area has decreased.

I think the diversity of population has helped CDA grow as a whole.

Some ways it's gotten better and others it's gotten worse.

It's really grown compared to what it used to be, people from other states have moved here, it's a different kind of better.

It's all give and take.

Because of the growth of the community.

There building a park next to the CDA resort and it looks like it will be a nice place for families.

I would say due to the traffic congestion.

I like the development that they've created.

It's the same to me. The only thing is that it's grown.

Because now there are more opportunities available to people.

Because some of the people that moved to the area trying to change things to the way it was from where they moved from.

I feel like it's overpopulated, and it's trying to be too much like Lake Tahoe.

Because the city has diversified. Diversity in goods, services, and businesses within the CDA area, which has drawn people from different cultures. These has enable the city to grow.

Approaching the retirement age, I find that there are a lot of services that are applicable to us.

Because the people that I've come across and met, or heard of. It is really hard to find good people these days.

Too many people with overcrowding and development. I live 22 miles north of CDA but still in Kootenai County and it is not a good retirement place in my opinion

Everything is pretty much the same.

There are more opportunities for people and things to do. The infrastructure including traffic and buildings are problematic.

I would have to say that there haven't been any huge changes.

It's gotten a lot of growth, a lot more job opportunities, extended the university, and has developed more.

Not a whole lot of people and not crime; I am good with that.

There's allot more options of stuff to do, there's been allot of development, more parks, happier to have kids here. There's a lot going on that's improved the area.

I think that it's grown in a positive way but it has lost a little bit of the small town feel due to the population.

I think we have moved to these areas to be in a community with a small town feel and things keep getting bigger.

Growth in population provide more opp. for jobs. Brought in a lot of people that don't share your own values.

It's no longer has a small town feel.

Because it has the good, the bad, and the ugly. Politics are ugly and the quality of life is good.

More shopping opportunities.

I think CDA is basically a tourist community and what we need is to focus on other issues.

Because of the development and the people moving in.

I can see the growth that's taking place, especially down. Expansion with the university. Tourism is growing here. A majority of businesses are mom and pop businesses, people coming in to help economy.

It's nice to have the stores and conveniences, it's just the traffic that's screwed up.

For us, it is just a nice place to live.

The population growth is way too fast.

It is getting too crowded.

The overall growth has brought bigger businesses and more convenience I guess.

A lot of development has happen. It's a nice looking place.

There is no infrastructure for the growth.

I think more businesses are being drawn here.

It has stayed the same because there are good things and bad things; they have cancelled each other out.

The addition of Kroc Center has been great; continue downtown growth, and a variety of businesses opening up. CDA always does things 1st class.

I think that overall people are happy to live here.

It seems like we haven't had any major changes.

The leadership has had some improvement here and there. In 1975 the stores didn't put in swails and trees, and now they have to do stuff like that. So the beautification projects has been big. I think people are paying more attention in beautifying their stores.

Nothing has really changed and the incoming people are all the same.

As I've grown up, I've seen more competitive jobs coming in, and poverty rate has gone down.

Too many people.

More people coming through and more businesses opening.

Because of the quality of people that have come here, they have outside mentalities.

Just the improvement in the area as a whole

Because they continue to grow and do a lot of things right. The thing I think is a good thing is the public libraries they build and the community as a whole is working hard to draw others into the area

I think that there has been an increase in crime.

It just hasn't changed much and the growth hasn't affected us at all. Still a good place to live.

Population growth

Because I think the balance between the political challenges has been consistent over time. You can't mess with climate too much. There's been a reaction in some circles against hyper-conservatism of the region, and that has been apparent in our recent elections. To balance out those two is what I'd look at.

There's some things that have grown, crime has gone up, and I liked it better when it was a little smaller, but that's progress.

There is too much traffic and too much development.

Because of the overpopulation and the inability to keep up with it.

I haven't been here long enough to know what it was before.

There has been a lot of growth as far as housing and everything.

The cost of living has been rising every year since I've been here.

There is not as many good paying jobs; there's more crime. It is just not as friendly a place as it used to be.

Californians are moving to the area.

The wages haven't improved and there haven't been a ton of openings for new jobs. The only thing that has changed is the population.

It's becoming more of a bigger city even though the traffic is getting worse.

They are slowly getting more jobs.

I think that as a whole the community is trying to expand and get out of the 70s, move into this century.

There are too many people.

Because now we have more options. There are more things to do around here.

It is a nice area to be from and to; went to school in Farragut.

There are more things to do here.

I've lived there before and now it's grown a lot and has more facilities, shopping and all that

Because more people have come so there is better activities and shopping. We have now bigger places and better things that we have before.

The changes with the economy are improving.

There are improvements regarding entertainment and recreation.

Because of the rapid growth and the mindset of those that are moving here. You cannot move away from your parenting problems they follow you.

It just seems like the economy has stayed the same, everything has stayed the same. The area where we live outside CDA has grown quite a bit, but I think CDA has stayed the same.

Because of the population growth, new developments, and traffic congestion.

Too many people.

Well we do have more shopping, before I had to go to Costco in Spokane, we didn't have a Wal-Mart and other main stores. We also didn't have the Silver Lake Mall and had to go to Spokane for everything

There were not as many jobs when I first moved here. Now there are more places to eat and shop.

Because the jobs have stayed the same and there are not many employment opportunities.

The progress is much better.

Because it hasn't gotten worse, I think it is just a better place to live.

It still offers the natural beauty that drew me here. I have all the conveniences of a bigger city, but I still have a sense of community.

I have only been here 5 years, and that really isn't enough time to see a significant change in anything.

We were able to attract new industries to replace dying ones.

I don't know, it's growing but it's stayed the same, it just has.

Not much has changed

The population growth has made CDA a little bit worse.

Crime has increased, gangs moving into the area and so on.

It's different but different in some good ways and some bad.

It just really hasn't changed much.

Expanded as far as available things to do as in shopping and arts. Traffic has increased

Because of the congestion of people.

More ethnic places to eat. There are more Doctors.

Crowding. Too crowded.

It's grown, the economy has been okay and the growth around the area.

The conservatism is going away and that is why I moved here, but there is more services available. Like the hospitals and retail. So both

Because people are thinking more about the result of future development and the residents are becoming more open-minded about growing.

Racism. Undercurrent of people in fear

I haven't really gotten to branch out.

It has gotten better, but it has gotten more crowded

Even though it's starting to get more services and businesses, but along with that there are a lot more people.

Because change is very slow.

They let people that have lived in urban areas and start changing the way people have lived here for hundreds of years, trying to live like it's a concrete city. Instead of coming and make better the ways that are here, they try to bring the ways that have FAILED.

They did do some improvement on the roads.

Things, business and stuff progressing. They're always building.

There has been a lot of changes for the better, improvements on the roads and stuff.

Nothing in particular, just small things over time.

It's become somewhat crowded and it's harder to get around. Transit has become a problem, not many transit options.

There's good things that have grown and bad things that have also grown.

CDA has a brand new library and Post Falls has a new library, the Croc center is an awesome place to go, and Mecum Park.

Some parts have gotten worse while other have gotten better, so they have kind of balanced each other out.

There are some areas that have improved and some areas that have declined.

It hasn't changed that much.

There are more jobs and better jobs. There are more openings for families.

There's not a whole lot of progress but some is being made.

Not much has changed.

I just think that the influx of people has had more negative effects than positive.

New businesses coming in offer many goods. There's less to commute for. New hospitals and schools with better services.

I don't have a straight answer. I just like it here.

It's has grown for the better because of the businesses that have come into the areas and the job market has opened up a bit in the past year.

Just the population growth, more criminals and accidents, big corporations are owning the lakefronts. They kept tearing it down and ruining it.

It has more national availability and shopping.

The population is growing, which is a downfall, but also a good thing.

Because I haven't been here long enough to know.

Because of the population growth, the fact that we have more people moving in, it's just become a pleasant place to live. It's become more progressive.

It's attracting a lot more tourism which is beneficial for the city and the state

There's not near as much crime and riff raft as the bigger cities.

It has gotten better and it hasn't gotten worse.

Population growth, and a lot more crime and drug abuse.

Well the development has slowed down.

Employment opp. more diversity. More dynamic. Natural resources and growth.

I like it more because I live here.

I think partly because of the economic downturn and everything has slowed down. It's pretty quiet and it's starting to grow again.

There are just too many people moving here. It's still a good place to live.

Because there has been a lot of growth, and while we liked it smaller, it has brought in more to do recreationally.

When times are economically tight you don't really see a lot of change.

I can see a lot of growth in changes. CDA is planning ahead and doing things now. They have a vision.

The fact that the population has grown a little bit, it brings more growth and more things for people to have. For example, more than one movie theater. I wouldn't care to see it any bigger than where it is, but it's safe and I like the way it is.

It has become larger, and they have built more parks, easily accessible.

I don't know, well it seems like everything is getting done, the highway the getting done and stuff. And it's very attractive to drive.

They have done a good job of beautifying the city and keeping up with the growth. We still are growing too much though, we don't have the road structures and such.

Nothing has really changed.

Not much has changed.

It really hasn't changed much. Still CDA.

It doesn't expand that much; it continues to stay smaller city. Nice outside and not all polluted.

I stayed here because of the weather and slower pace. It hasn't changed so I'm still here.

The whole education thing, the environment that some of these kids grow up in. I don't know about CDA, but it's bad here in Plummer. It's probably gotten worse to live anywhere with all these gov't things going on and the economy.

Just the population and all the regulations that go with it.

I think it's because the economic activity has accelerated. The economic diversity has moved from Cali and other places.

I think the people who run the town are interested in keeping it very similar to what it has been. They don't want too many changes.

For me, nothing has changed really.

We are ahead of the other states, values, conservatism.

I don't know.

When we moved here it was pretty desolate and behind times. Fire districts and what not have improved since then.

The population is growing too fast.

Once again the leadership of the community is making unilateral decisions, spending tax payer money, tore up Tubbs hill, everything they do is not honest, and they don't care about anybody else.

They have more upscale businesses, increased tourism, and most people know where CDA is from different parts of the country.

I think it's because even though it is growing it has tried to keep the small town feel.

The only change I really see is the roads have improve somewhat but the living is still the same.

We have become more and more a tourist town. And have become quite arrogant about our city. We pay for the tourist attractions and we don't get to use it.

Not much has changed.

Population increase.

It hasn't changed at all really. It's a wonderful place to live and it hasn't gotten worse either.

I think that they have improved our structure. I think the problem is that they don't look at the big picture.

I believe it is because of the drugs and theft. We used to never have that and you used to be able to leave your house open, and you can't do things like that anymore.

Modernism is becoming normal.

I don't see any major spikes in crime and the basic cost of living has not increased.

Things have picked up, there is work compared to 30 years ago. It's more a tourist place and they need to get away from that.

It doesn't seem to be any different, beauty is the same?

It has grown too fast.

Mostly because the people have desired it to be a country type.

The Mayberry small-town atmosphere, and it's changed, the community has grown, and they're not getting ready for the changes that are coming. People come here for the great outdoors.

Nothing has changed that much.

Well it has grown and developed in a good way there are more opportunities.

More people.

More people becoming active.

The growth has been tremendous in this area.

So many things have changed. Some prices have gone up. Driving laws have changed. It's harder to get a business license here than California. My mother was 91, and she had Medicare Advantage. She had a really good one in California. Here it didn't work and they gave me some new options and none of them paid very well. So I have to deal with hospital bills.

I think CDA in the area have tried to keep things as beautiful and current and up to date with infrastructure and tried to grow with the times, however just a little difficult tourists in the area, it is more of a tourist town so they grew around tourism and unfortunately their jobs with tourism tend to be lower income.

Not much has changed.

Not crazy about the growth of it. Has grown a lot for shopping. The traffic has increased over the years; going down 95 is a pain in the butt.

The reservation issues and the schools

I think they are starting to crack down on more of the drugs that is around and clean it up a little bit.

The crock center, the library, and the park.

The tribe itself has been growing, jobs are growing, and we are doing more things environmentally.

It has grown a lot but not a whole lot; community wise and populations wise.

Just because I really haven't seen much change other than the size.

Maybe the growth and development.

They are meeting the needs of the people.

Well, I think they have a good quality city, and I think they know what they are doing on the job, and a good fire department in the area, and it is a safe place to live.

It hasn't affected me in any way thus far.

I think it is still keeping its small town charm but it has attract some economic growth and help businesses in the area.

There are not enough jobs and too much crime.

Just because it has changed and the growth has been good with good things, adding different centers and shopping areas. More things have become available like shopping and health care.

I would say that the government control of businesses has limited growth.

With the population, more population you get more services. The hospital gets better and you get more qualified individuals.

The weather. Except population grows to fast.

The population growth has gotten worse but we got better hospitals and more shopping.

The crime rate is way up.

Well because there are a greater variety of jobs available nowadays. In some ways it's become a more open community as the population has grown.

There is too much traffic and people are less friendly.

Kroc Center being there and the park coming in. And the vision is growing.

There wasn't appropriate planning for growth in infrastructure. And secondly I think it has become more culturally liberal and socially and economically liberal.

It is too commercialized and jobs are down.

I think that a lot of good shopping, businesses and recreational opportunities have become more prominent in the last few years.

Our political system! It's stayed the same for better or worse because of the same political system.

There has been needed growth here and the school systems are better than they were, they wouldn't pass the school bonds and the schools were in dire need of help so that is better now.

Because of the congestion and population growth.

It's gotten a lot bigger, but some of the amenities are nice. There are pros and cons, but it is equal.

The economic development and the growth are really improving the quality of life.

We are getting access to more. More medical and other services that we used to be required to go to Spokane are more available. It's improving our quality of life because of the movement of business.

In some ways it has become a better place to live, in other ways it has become a worse place to live.

More people are moving up here.

I haven't seen any changes since I've been here.

It's been growing, better roads, better schools, and better hospitals. Growth brings infrastructure.

I've seen an increase in nonprofits and our community's increase to become environmentally aware.

I have only been here a year and it seems the same.

We don't have to go to Spokane for shopping. More people seem involved, not just politics but everything.

There is certainly more activity and it is nationally recognized by others. Businesses have flourished here.

I know that we don't have the timber industry we used to have, it's more into tourism. Because the mills are down. Some of the mines are too.

Population growth.

I see there are a lot of things in CDA that is advantage for people who live here. I see the industry, we don't really have a lot of here. The surrounding area and there is a lot of outdoor activities, like fishing and hunting and the camping!

The population growth takes away some of the peace, but growth has to happen. I don't have anything against people moving here. Makes it a little crowded, and prices go up.

The growth.

I miss the fresh air because of the population growth.

Because they got rid of the Arian nation. There is a place up here now called the Human Rights Organization. That has been something they have really needed

I think a lot of it is due to the greater support of the public to help improve the area.

We are retired and I don't see any changes.

It is a mixed bag. Something's are better, but at the same time human relationships are really strained. Everyone is so divided.

Even though I see a lot of homes going up, it still has that small town kind of feel.

It has grown but not as much.

Nothing has really changed a whole lot in Plummer.

We've expanded with the schools and improved them. Compared to other cities, we've handled the growth really well, it's pretty easy to get around in CDA.

With the increase of population there has been an increase in crime.

Too many Californians moving in and changing the way we live and have been living for years.

Because there some improvements, but the crowding and traffic are increasing too.

There are more business, more restaurants, and more things to do.

It has its pros and cons. The growth has brought good and bad to the community.

Because I'm not really into the growth. I've much rather keep it to ourselves

Improved the roads.

Mainly because I think the educational opportunities, with all the colleges around, they have the U of I extension program here as well as NIC.

As former business owners the area promotes itself beautifully. Various community events in downtown area.

I think that there are some people who've been progressive of the growth. The downtown area has really grown.

We have lost our big industry and there is no replacement jobs.

Crime is getting bad. Downtown area is starting to bring in more crime

I liked it when they had more work here. There's a lot of people going without work. They took out the jobs for the people that come and shop and tour here. This is what it is now. It's not like it used to be.

I'm not really social, it just seems like a place to live.

There's more businesses and culture.

It's gotten too crowded for me. I don't like crowds.

I really don't know. It's losing its small town feel, becoming more metropolitan.

There is a lot more activity with the human rights and the CDA tribe, I think when they invest into the community economically, educationally, and socially to help, they are able to build upon and then the people are able to use that money for program. This helps the community.

Because of the jobs that have been cut, and both moms and dads are working to make ends meet.

There is not a lot of crime.

There are more amenities and more things are localized.

Because the draw to the area is the beauty of the mountains, the lake will not disappear and it is a great advantage to the area.

They maintain a good infrastructure, they seem to do some good planning and developing, their zoning is practical and realistic. They're a very conservative place, but for a very conservative place they enjoy a good standard of living.

There's a large shift in the econ. Base here. Mostly moved to tourism and away from the logging mills. Then again there are ups and downs, with ups being more jobs and lesser skilled jobs.

The population growth is becoming too much with the people and the buildings. It's losing its quaintness.

I don't have enough information to say either way. Some of the changes that have happened you have to wait a few years before you see the outcome and I haven't been here long enough.

What is lacking made up in other areas with business opportunities and recreational activities.

I think that there are more crimes being committed. Also, the gangs that have been formed are largely ignored by tribal police.

I like that it used to be smaller now is a big place.

Because nothing's changed.

I just think that there is a lot more care into building and making sure people are doing things safely. There are a lot more houses being built and the community is more family friendly.

When we first came here the hospital and airport used to be all gravel, and now it's beautiful.

I think that it has become cleaner, and we enjoy it more.

I would have to say that we have more recreational activities and more things to do downtown.

Because it has developed a lot more in term of having more businesses in the area.

With growth the crime rate has gone up.

The medical services and all the other services are better but the crime is worse.

We have more services here. We might get a Trader Joe's, and we are going to get a Winco. There are more services available.

Things don't really change that much around this area.

The medical services that are just fantastic. Just fantastic. Now we have really got it.

The growth of the right things.

It hasn't changed much, there are still as many jobs as there weren't a few years ago.

Because they have promoting tourism for this area.

There's more shopping and it's grown as far as convenience

The population is the only thing that's growing.

Because of the economics.

I haven't seen much difference in the 3 years that I've been here.

Better commerce. Increase in shopping.

Crime hasn't really gone up or down. The schools are good here. They are not going downhill or things like that, if things were going down I wouldn't want to live here.

They're are doing a lot of community development.

Nothing has really changed around me.

I would say the community has grown further apart, employers are not respectful, and we don't have a lot of opportunities here.

I would say that it is due to traffic congestion and housing developments.

I think people care about the city and how it grows. The growth has been methodical.

I think they are offering more things, like the plays. They are offering more to the public than before.

People are willing to change with the times and yet we're still keeping the bigger politics out of the state.

Stagnant economy.

It still is a friendly community, education hasn't changed.

Great deal on tourism and we have a bad economy.

Government has their way about everything.

I think it's stayed the same because most people here use common sense and they don't jump on every bandwagon that comes along.

There has been significant population growth but it doesn't impact the quality of life. The quality of life has pretty much stayed the same.

There has been a lot of improvements with the roads and other parts of the city.

The population growth has made a little worse, but it's still a really great place to live, so I don't blame people for wanting to come here. But overpopulation destroys things. I'm a fisherman, and I can't eat trout anymore, I have to release everything! We've got so many people it's destroyed many elements.

Continues to improve with the activities.

I think that there are things that have gotten better and there are things that have gotten worse. It isn't as small town as used to be. I'm not against growth but the crime rates have risen.

The tourist traffic.

It's either better or we've just gotten to know it's in's and out's.

Probably because you have a little more things available to use. The tribe is putting in a fiber optics and there is a hospital being built.

Some things could've been handled better. Like the flow of people coming in, we're not handling it right.

Rich people are moving in & our taxes are increasing our property taxes, it is becoming a Sun Valley here.

There are more services available because of more people in the area.

The population has leveled off, when I first came here it was booming but now it's leveled off.

Well the Krock Center is neat, and the Woman Center.
Not a lot of jobs and cost of living is really high.

I think that it hasn't changed much and I'm happy with that.

For us, the highway 95 has improved between Plumber and CDA. I think that education has a lot more educational opportunities in CDA with the university offering a lot more classes.

It's improved in some aspects, but gotten worse in others, so it's neither better nor worse.

I would say because of the shopping and the stores that have been introduced.

The population is growing too much for me.

The growth and management is a positive thing.

I think it's a good place to raise a family, and there's not a lot of crime here.

Well I hardly ever go into CDA and the parts that I see, other than the fact that it's growing too fast, it's pretty much the same.

People moving here from all over and they find a good home and I think the housing is fairly affordable.

It's all the changes and things are getting taken out of the city.

Because of KMC because there is no other hospital and I worry about my own health.

Because it's growing and the people that are working to make it a better area.

I think just because the way we have made a living over the decades has changed for the better with our natural resources.

The influence of people is the same.

More development as far as Park and Rec. Better schools and more businesses.

I have gotten used to the winters, accustomed to the change.

There are a lot more recreational opportunities than before. There are more parks and the old ones have been refurbished. There are more commercial outlets than there used to be. Before you had to go to Spokane to go to Spokane to get Target and Best Buy.

Everybody knows everyone so people are more willing to help each other out. Churches are more willing to help out too.

I still feel safe, the air is good, not full of smog and everything else, unlike San Diego, where I was. It's clean.

Because I remember how we could see the lake and now not anymore.

I would have to say due to traffic congestion and population growth.

People are beginning to realize that we need to work as a community together and school bond issues are getting passed. The infrastructure has been improving.

I think that there are a lot more people from outside states. I think people are trying harder to make Coeur d'Alene a better place to live by activism. I live in Spirit Lake and we've had our problems with white supremacists. I have seen that in Coeur d'Alene as well. I'm glad to see people stand up against that and that makes me very proud.

People come here to work hard and to make it better.

I think that I haven't seen a lot of changes. I've only been here for 4 years.

I think there's a lack of moderation in the politics. There seems to be the pull to bring people all the way over to the conservative. I see that in the middle is where we need to try to meet.

Because it hasn't changed much around here, just more people.

It's almost the same, it's just the population and the people down there, and it's gotten kind of crazy.

They kicked out the whole Aryan nation people, it's become more multi-cultural.

We've had a lot of people come in to the area with new businesses, but with that there's a bigger influx of people which has its drawbacks, but overall it's good for the community.

There are definitely more activities that everyone can do and if you look at NIC there are a lot of opportunities for people to get degrees even if they are older. CDA offers a lot of associate's degrees to people of all ages. CDA does a really good job of creating jobs that fit into the descriptions of degrees received from NIC. It is like a building block community. At least that is what I have noticed.

I noticed how the job situation is here, people are not treated with enough respect. You also have to fight really hard to find a job. Because they know how badly you need your job, they feel they can treat you like crap.

There is so much going on that I don't agree with. For example, the buildings and park that they're putting downtown. Too much money was spent on the park, when there are so many other things that the community needs doing.

There is not much crime.

Because it's starting to get crowded. A lot of people like that but I don't.

Kind of tough to answer that because I'm sold already on the place. I don't have an answer for that.

I moved here thinking that I'm okay to hunt and fish, and then they tell me no, and that my son is wrong for doing this activity. Two-Faced City.

Because my daughter has been in school for a few years and nothing is happening.

It's stayed the same except all the buildings up here.

No middle class here. You're either rich or poor.

Because there hasn't been any major stuff lately. I haven't seen any major stuff going on.

All the traffic and the congestion and the people that are moving here. It's starting to get overpopulated.

Because there are too many people. Population growth.

I don't know it just is.

Just the way it seems to me!

Q8 Why is that?

Economy is getting worse and making it a hard to live. Beautiful area but needs to get better economy

Higher crime, higher population, etc. I think one of the biggest negative things coming in the area is higher regulations, especially for businesses.

Lack of leadership.

Cash flow into the area, more things will bring people into the area.

I don't know

I think that as a small town, the roads are equipped for a smaller town. It is getting congested.

I think that there will be more jobs and more economic stability.

Just the population's growing and CDA seems like a better place to be.

I think probably because of traffic and population increase. Population increase equals an increase in crime

I just don't think there's a lot of room for more growth. It may get a little bit better, but I think it will stay about the same.

Not much changes.

I just think that community members are willing to put the effort into what is going on.

I think that the jobs will bring more people in.

Because I think new people are moving in all the time and it's such a beautiful place to live. Even the weather is good. I thought winters would be bad but they are not at all.

I think the economy is improving, but it still needs work.

Too many people are coming here.

I think it will get worse before it gets better. Crime rates have increased a lot.

It's all based on the economy. Things will move much faster than it has in the last 5 years

Lack of community; becoming a big city. Economy is where crime is getting worse. Coffee shops getting robbed; Crime is 10x worse than I remember.

Too many people.

I would say that it depends on the elections. If they go well it will become a better place to live.

Not much will change for quite some time.

Growth will bring more wealth for the community. It might become a worse place for our children because of all the people coming and bringing in their problems.

Changes need to happen but it seems slow.

Housing developments are growing; would never have gotten a Walmart or other shopping facilities.

It seems like they're expanding quite a bit.

I have not seen anything regarding improvement plans for the future.

Again, jobs, building companies, having the right political support, having the right people in the right places that will support the right decision will lead it to be better. I'm pro-growth. I think that with pro-growth comes better education and better jobs.

Improvement in a lot of things like technology.

Because of the type of people moving here

I hope that it will become better for the natives.

Because there is a lot of good people who have been hired in various sectors. These people contribute knowledge to the city.

I just like to be optimistic.

Because I just don't see people changing the way the atmosphere is and I don't see that happening any time soon

Because of the growth and development and the farm fields have been turned into housing developments. It is the whole changing of the area

More people moving in there and crime rate will go up

Because people are seeing there are certain qualities CDA has, beauty of the place and small town atmosphere, and people are seeing that they can keep these qualities even with population growth.

I think that the population will increase and it will become more congested.

Depends on the crime and if the laws get stiffer.

Depends on what they do with some of the regulations they're trying to put in. They're trying to come up with a good plan on everything and they're overstepping their line, too much government

More people move in there will be more crime.

Because it's good it's bad and there's no indication that any of this is going to change. In life it's all relative.

They're not growing too fast, they seem to be growing steadily and making the changes they need.

Because unless anything changes, the people in charge of the community don't listen to the people they represent.

I think a lot of obsessed religious people move into the area and I like it better when it is more liberal.

More culture coming into the area. Four years ago, I don't recall ever seeing a black American and now I'm seeing more and more Latinos.

No matter how good the intentions, the more people a place gets, and the worse it'll get.

Because more people will come in and the community will not be ready to grow with it.

The increasing growth will get even more businesses and there will be more local jobs.

No reason for it to get worse, so I would think it would get better.

They are not building infrastructure and there will be more population.

More technology companies are coming to the area, and the area will be a haven for them.

God will eventually come and take back what's his and he will make it much better. It's not anything that man does or government does.

I think it has a lot of momentum; a lot of people in love with CDA; lived in big cities and small towns and CDA is great place to live. It is very well liked by a lot of people who go there and can't wait to come back.

I think that the community will pull together and help the community overall.

I'm not sure.

I think there will be more tourism and that people will want to protect the environment more.

Politics

Increased public transportation and increased business and more social and activities available.

Because of all the people relocating up here,

Because of the mentality of the people that have moved in here from California, they're trying to implement their ideas in here.

I think that it will just stay the same and that not a lot will come in or change

Optimistic that they will continue to draw people in their communities

I don't have a particular reason.

I am not sure about the future

Population will add to increasing houses and the area will not be as beautiful.

Just don't know what the future has for the area.

I think we're becoming more sophisticated more aware. A lot of people around here think it's still a small town or small community, but there's a perception that we're getting bigger, and there are things that need to be addressed when getting more urban. Public transportation, land use, etc.

I know we have a pretty good police dept. over here that I think benefits us. The 911 system here is really excellent.

Well I just think that the northwest is the place to live. We have it all here. I think it will be better because people will try to make it better

I think that because of its natural beauty and the Californians that are already here. The Californians will tell their friends, and not just them, but people from all over the country will hear of it and come here.

The overpopulation.

Spokane is 30 miles away and it's the closest big city to here and as more people move in and the area do seem to keep up as far as infrastructure goes, the not-so-desirable things like traffic

and services that the state provides. There's a lot of things that will get worse and I don't see CDA meeting those demands.

It will continue to grow during the economy.

Depends on the crime and if the laws get stiffer.

I see the strides that our community is making toward art and public land development. Things that are beautifying the area.

Based on what I see and my perceptions of what it is now.

I plan on staying there the rest of my life.

Increased population.

I think that the amount of higher paying jobs will stay about the same.

I think it just getting too large and is getting a "big city" feel to it. Tourism is becoming too big and the small town charm is being taken away.

Because it's growing and the tourist population is growing and we're maintaining the city.

General trend is positive but it's slow.

It's trying to expand too fast, and it's going to get caught in a bind and not go anywhere.

I would like to think that they will make it better.

Because I think that nothing stays the same and you hope that it will be somewhat better.

Because everybody enjoys the lake to go fishing or swimming or whatever.

Because over time they can get their issues figure out and have better jobs.

Because they are continuously making improvements.

Because people are still going to move here motivated for the wrong reasons and when more people come everything increases; crime etc.

CDA hasn't had a lot of growth. Everybody lives on the outskirts because it's cheaper. But everybody goes there because of its attractions. But all the areas will grow.

I think people adjust to it pretty easy so I don't think there will be significant changes that will affect people greatly.

The roads have gotten better access to things and they are starting to upgrade as much as possible. They say a lot more stores and things have come in. I just don't want to see it grow like Spokane

Because more people will be moving to this area and this will make it harder to find jobs.

The growth is slow.

Because I think we will have good leadership in the community

The leadership and how they covet what drew me to this area to begin with. They are good at expanding and improving upon the natural beauty of the area.

I hate to say it, but any good place to live it only has one way to go. It's not up it's down. As more people come here we start getting more of the bad.

Borrowing against the future taxpayers. The government has given so much money to projects that will be worn out long before they've been completed or paid themselves off.

Its growing and new things are coming in. It will be for new people and there will be new things to do.

Not much has changed.

I think more and more people will come to live here and it won't get any better. I do love the lake though, it's nice to be able to do things outdoors.

As the population then crime increases, and the local law enforcement has not been increasing in order to deal with it.

Better because of some of the improvements they're doing downtown and the planning for larger events

I just think it's a good place to live.

It has some limitations as how far it can grow.

Because the city will grow and adapt to welcome more people.

Some of the construction is messy downtown; more parking will come soon.

Continue to stay strong and keep growing.

The democrats moving in.

I think there is a lot of younger people that are getting involved in local politics and with their ideas they will help the city to grow.

Racism and fear will overtake the population and erupt.

It's just a beautiful place to live and a nice place to raise a family.

Because I hope and believe that people are smart enough to realize what is going on and how to fix it.

I see a lot of people coming in to the community, but a lot of them are financially devastated. Lack of resources for the new people moving in to town.

I think it will continue to increase the access to the outdoors and make schools better.

I don't think it will expand much in the next few years.

The lord works in mysterious ways.

It will be difficult to make major changes in the future.

I think it will be over populated and there will be a lot more crime.

I think people are rational, I think people have the ability to see what going on around them and to make life better as opposed to moving back the midcentury.

We'll see what happens

It seems to me that's how it changes here, kind of a slow change.

Cause of city development. More jobs and better economy.

Because I think there is major interest in the downtown area, and more tuned into attracting tourists instead of industries that are going to attract better wages? When I first moved here there were a lot of mills but now they are shut down and it is hard to make a decent living.

Development is hard.

Emerging industries. Higher tech industries.

I think with the population growth more people will be more involved with the community. There won't be any more small town politics.

It's still growing, but I think it can only grow so much and I like this area smaller.

I don't think it is as bad as it is.

I just think that if we continue on with their vision, the jobs will come and the schools will improve in Idaho overall.

The bigger the population, the bigger the crime rate. For years I've had no problem leaving my keys in my car, but I can't do that in WA, it'll get to the point where you'll have to lock your house and your car. But it is what it is.

That's because of the population increase. With population growth you get gangs, and heavy crime. The bigger you get the more of that you get.

I just see the tendency in the population growth and service may not keep up with the growth.

I don't think it'll go backwards. A lot of people are waking up to the income problem. Stuff like that, it'll pick up.

The growth pattern, and elected officials will help.
I like the community.

It just attracts a just a friendly type person

It depends on whether or not the people who are overseeing development start actually making plans great for the whole community and not just a few people. There's over 60,000 people in CDA and post falls area, it's grown quite a bit over the years, and you can't tell the difference between the two. And if they don't start working together, they'll have one side developing one thing different than the other. It'd be good to work within city limits, but traffic needs to be taken care of.

I don't think there will be big changes, and they have a sufficient amount of things they need, why change it.

I hope that we have enough intelligent people in the area that will make wise choices

More people. I like it when it was 20 years ago, less people.

There is a lot work going on here to expand the industry to bring in different opportunities, especially for the younger people.

I think that everyone will stay small town and people don't like change.

The politics here are pushing things and the quality of life is different. It is declining

Because of the traffic congestion and population growth.

The population will get to the point where it isn't a small town anymore.

There will still be hassle over the little things.

I think we are becoming large enough that our percentage of undesirables is increasing. I think crime has gone up and values are deteriorating. Because it's getting bigger. Bigger seems to be less personal.

We have kids that have big dreams to go to college and get degrees to return to their hometown.

Because the area is progressing.

It's just a good community and people will come together. They already have stuff in works, like the hydroplanes on the lake.

I don't know. I don't think about it that much.

I'm concerned about the radically conservative movements that are happening in Boise, Idaho.

If the people from California keep coming like me, the traffic will increase. But the old timers say it's not getting any better but we are all hopeful.

Because more people are getting involved in what's going on.

I think that more people will become part of the community and take interest as things grow.

Well because of the influx of people, and most of the industry around here was timber mills, and mining isn't doing any good. It's mostly low-paying tourist jobs!

Population growth. It will just keep getting bigger.

With the influx of the of people who are coming here, like from California, they are bringing in more ideas for the communities.

Bad attitudes, the lack of love for other people, or less and less love of others. Leadership is getting more and more selfish, but that's not unique to the area, that's a worldwide thing.

It's far enough away where we aren't influenced with other people moving in and changing policies as we are used to in this North Idaho area.

We have a lot of areas we can improve in, and I think the city and the people are realizing that and stepping up. They're improving vacant and low-income areas, and the city does a lot of stuff for people with the free concerts and farmers market and stuff like that. A lot of good things for people to get together for.

Because right now the population in our county is about 67% people moved in from California. They want this place to look like home and they are succeeding in changing it.

Increase in population and basically just becoming so populated; many internal problems.

Because everyone is trying to change our way of life.

Depends on the economy, and what the Obamacare will do to our country.

Because of all the good people that live around here.

Draw similar people to those that are here already.

They have the room, the water, and the resources, everything necessary. I don't think it will deteriorate at all.

I see trends that it won't be a worse place in the future.

Because they are building too much. We are going to lose the quaintness of the whole area.

The way the development is going it will get worse. It looks like they are trying to do things like they do in California and that would be a big mistake.

The potential and growth that is taking place. The new grocery stores, river park area, and other projects. These will improve employment and tourism as well as school improvements

Because people aren't paying attention and doing the right thing. The economic basis is going the wrong way

I don't think jobs will be brought in so it won't change at all.

Because there's a lot of people who think they can get away with anything in Idaho. There's a lot of vandalism on public land that didn't used to be there. There aren't as many police here.

I hope it becomes better. But there's a lot of development which seems good for now at least

I can't see any reason why it couldn't. Already they have improve the highway, it's easier to get to town.

So many people moving to the area, I'm not blaming them, but they bring things with them. When people move there they bring their problems with them. We're going to develop into a bigger city, but we can't do anything about it. And as we develop as a city we develop big city problems. And we won't be prepared for it.

All of the property around CDA has been bought. Oprah has a house worth \$5 million. It displaces the locals.

There is not too much more room for people to move in.

I would like a better quality of government leaders. I would like to see more truly professional people step forward as leaders to run for office. They don't have to make it a career, but to bring in their expertise. I don't like to see people from out of state to come in and do studies. We have a lot of available brains in this area.

To be a safe family oriented area.
